### Marshal Brian Cook

- -Reported that the 3 new police cars are getting striped and waiting to hear from the company to get them equipped next. Plates have arrived and thanked Clerk's office for getting those.
- -Looking into getting a Grant to update their defibrillators, ones in the vehicles are the old version.
- -MVH department is doing a great job with the roads.

## Public Works Director John Mrozinski

- -Gave accolades to the MVH department on keeping the streets so clean, they are some of the best. Also gave accolades to the Electric department on their hard work. He really appreciates it.
- -John directed comments to Marshal Cook and stated that he stopped in Pheonix, AZ at the Historic Police Society building to look around and received a badge from them. They would like us to send them a badge in return. There are a ton of them on the wall and the gentleman that runs the Society is from Indiana. Brian stated that he will definitely make that happen.
- -Attended the Parks meeting and they are in approval of putting in the Pickleball Courts on the top side of Bourissa Park. Dr. Howard Wiesjahn was at the meeting, and he has attended many tournaments throughout the states and wants to be involved in procurement and installation of the courts. Carl Brown-Grimm is now the President of the Parks Board. Sarah Mitchell is now on the board as well.
- -Will be spending money out of Water Capitol for membranes for a RO (reverse osmosis) unit and also need to order a master water meter at the Cliff's plant which is at least 30 years old.
- -The weather has been too cold to start any repairs to the clock at the front of the Town Hall building. Once the weather breaks then the Electric Department will start the project on figuring out what needs to be done to repair it. The company it was purchased from is out of business, but they found a company in Ohio where they can purchase parts.

## IT Services

- Two agreements for IT services to upgrade the Town Hall and Police Department network were presented by ADM Computer Solutions and Edge IT Services. President Kauffman stated that since they have been using ADM for 25 years that she would like to recommend to the council that we use him for a 1-year contract. VP Colanese asked about the CJIS certification that was needed to be able to be IT services for the Police Department. Clerk-Treasurer Brown let Jerry know that ADM did acquire the necessary certification. A motion was made by Council Member Short to accept the agreement from ADM Solutions for 1 year. The motion was seconded by Council Member Pemberton. Motion carried 5-0.

### **New Business**

### Surf Internet agreement

-Revised agreement with Surf to be similar to Bright Speed and Comcast. Surf will pay per connection per year (to the Town poles). This connection allows Surf to bring services to customers. This agreement outlines expectations and helps the Town keep control on any and all attachments. Attorney Halpin asked if we could request Surf to update their certificate of insurance to be sure to add us as an Additional Insured. A motion to approve the agreement was made by Council Member Abbot. The motion was seconded by VP Colanese. Motion carried 5-0.
